Key issues at COP-5



- Decide to list Endosulfan in Annex A with specific exemptions
- Adopt recommendations on elimination of BDEs from waste stream and on risk reduction for PFOS
- Adopt a procedure for updating the guidance on best available techniques and best available practices for unintentionally produced POPs



- Adopt a six-year process evaluating the effectiveness of the Convention
- Consider new ways of facilitating the work of the financial mechanism of the Convention, including a possible financial resources group under the COP
- Consider establishing compliance procedures under the Convention



- New activities to be considered:
 - GEF MSP Projects on new POPs: Development of guidance documents for NIP update and GMP activities,
 - Brokering tool: Service for matching potential donor resources with the needs of Parties that are developing countries and countries in transition
 - Regional Center Small Grant Programme: Grants to SCRCs to undertake projects in regions



New activities:

POPs-free: voluntary industry initiative to promote production/marketing of products that do not contain POPs


Outreach:

Synergies:

- Ex-COPs achievements
- SC COP-5 will consider approving:
- new joint activities,
- modifications to the secretariats' organizational structure,
- terms of references for reviewing the synergies processes.
- Identical synergies decisions would have to be adopted by SC, RC and BC COPs



Programme of work and Budget for 2012 2013

- Organized around two core functions responsibilities:
 - Meetings of the Conference of the Parties and its subsidiary bodies and
 - Programme and support functions including both
 Stockholm specific and joint activities with Basel and
 Rotterdam
- Synergies component of the budget adopted at SC COP-5 would need to be adopted identically in Rotterdam and Basel COPs

Proposed budget presented in three scenarios for 2012-2013



- Scenario 1: Executive Secretary's assessment (+9.5%)
- Scenario 2: 0% nominal growth budget
- Scenario 3: 10% nominal growth budget
 - Since Scenario 1 budget is very close to 10%, the same proposed budget also covers Scenario 3
 - No separate proposed budget for Scenario 3

Scenario 1: Executive Secretary's assessment (+9.5%)

- Operational budget: \$12,828,961
- Includes all decisions made during the period as well as requests received from Parties
- Special Trust Fund: \$8,725,860 (a 21.8% increase from the 2010-2011 estimated amount)
- Includes new Stockholm Convention-specific and joint activities
- No changes to current staffing level

Scenario 2: 0% nominal growth budget



- Operational budget: \$11,769,209
- Represents a real reduction in budget
- Eliminates all activities under the new POPs
 Programme or part of activities under capacity assistance, including costs of one Programme
 Officer at P-3 level
- Special Trust Fund: \$7,511,110 (a 4.8% increase from the 2010-2011 estimated amount)
