Who is eligible for technical assistance?

Developing country Parties and Parties with economies in transition

What are the policies and strategies for technical assistance?

Technical assistance should be:

- Offered efficiently and appropriately
- Country driven
- To support the activities identified in National Implementation Plans of the Party seeking assistance
- Take into consideration guidance on Best Available Techniques and Best Environmental Practices (BAT/BEP)
- Promote synergies with other relevant multilateral environmental agreements

What will regional and sub-regional centres do?

Transfer of environmentally sound technologies Capacity-building to implement the Convention

Areas of Technical Assistance

- Developing, updating and implementing NIP
- Review of infrastructure, capacity and institution
- Training for decision-makers, managers and personnel in:
 - ➤ POPs identification
 - > Technical assistance need identification
 - > Project proposal writing
 - > Legislative development and enforcement
 - > Development of POPs inventory
 - > Risk assessment and management of PCB and PCDD/F
 - > Evaluation of social and economic impacts
 - ➤ Development of pollutant release and transfer registers (PRTR)
- Develop and strengthen research capacity in:
 - ➤ Alternatives to POPs
 - > Training of technical personnel

Mandate

Article 12 of the Stockholm Convention recognizes rendering of timely and appropriate technical assistance in response to requests from developing country Parties and Parties with economies in transition is essential to the successful implementation of the Convention. The article also provisioned to establishing appropriate arrangements such as regional centres for providing technical assistance and transfer of technology. The Article makes the provision of issuing further guidance in this regard by the Conference of the Parties.

COP Decisions

COP I

The first Conference of the Parties adopted decision SC-1/15 on guidance on technical assistance and requested to report on progress in application of this guidance in each meeting of the Conference of Parties.

COP II

The second meeting adopted the terms of reference for regional and sub-regional centres for capacity-building and transfer of technology under the Stockholm Convention.

COP III

The third meeting adopted the terms of reference for the selection of regional and sub-regional centres for capacity-building and transfer of environmentally sound technologies.
