### Reporting (Art. 15)

- Party to report to COP on the measures taken to implement the Convention and on their effectiveness
- In addition, each Party shall provide to the Secretariat:
  - (a) total quantities of production, import and export of each of the chemicals listed in Annexes A and B
  - (b) to the extent practicable, a list of the importing and exporting States

## Other reporting timelines

- **DDT: Every 3 years**
  - **For Parties that produce/use DDT, information is required on:**
    - amount produced/used,
    - conditions of use,
    - relevance to that Party's disease management strategy
  - **Format developed in collaboration with WHO decided at COP-3**

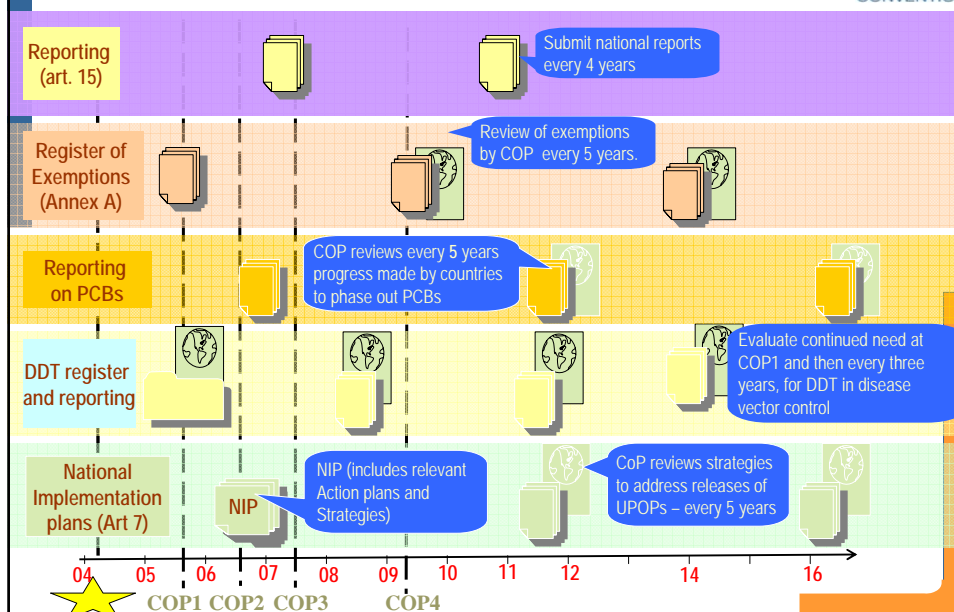
## DDT reporting

- **Section A: production and use of DDT**
- **Section B: DDT alternatives (insecticides, methods and strategies)**
- **Section C: general human and environmental safety issues**
- **Section D: systems strengthening in disease vector control**

## Other reporting timelines

- **UPOPs & PCBs: every 5 years**
  - **Review of strategies to identify and reduce UPOPs releases as part of NIP document**
  - **A progress report in eliminating PCBs and submit it to the Conference of the Parties pursuant to Article 15**


## Timeline for reporting



## General reporting (Art. 15)

### □ COP

- Adopted the format for reporting;
- Agreed on the periodicity
  - 1 national report: 31 December 2006
  - 2 national report: 31 December 2010
- Adopted an electronic system for reporting, available on the web at:

## Reporting (Art. 15)

- The Secretariat provides two accounts to Parties:
  - **Administrator**
    - User ID
    - Password
  - **Technical**
    - User ID
    - Password

## Electronic system

- The format has three parts
  - **Part A:** requires information on the OCP submitting the report
  - **Part B:** requires general information on the implementation of the Convention
  - **Part C:** requires specific information on PCBs

## Status of submission

- First reporting deadline was set in Dec. 2006 for COP-3 consideration
- COP-3 invited Parties to submit their reports in July 07 to be used as part of effectiveness evaluation (39 received)
- 31 Dec 08: 46 received

## Status of submission

Issue	Developed Country Parties	Developing country Parties or Parties with economies in transition	Total number of Parties submitting reports
Number of reports submitted to the Secretariat	16	30	46
Number of reports submitted through official channels	16	28	44
Number of accepted reports which included parts A and B	16	28	44
Number of accepted reports which included part C	15	22	37
Number of accepted reports submitted through the electronic system for reporting	11	19	30
Number of accepted reports submitted through other means and data entered by the Secretariat	5	9	14

## Overall outcomes of reports

- **NIP:**
  - 98% had developed NIP (61% with GEF funding);
  - 86% have transmitted their NIP to COP,
  - 25 % reported difficulties in implementing NIP
- **Article 3:**
  - High rates (~90%) regarding legal measures taken to restrict production/use and import of Art. 3 chemicals (an. A and B)
  - Rate of 60% for legal measures for prohibiting export of listed substances

## Overall outcomes of reports

- **UPOPs:**
  - 52% have evaluated their releases;
  - 68% have developed related Action Plan;
  - 36% have reported difficulties in implementing it;
- **Stockpiles/wastes:**
  - ~ 75% have developed strategies to identify them;
  - 66% have adopted legislative measures;
  - 36% have identified their stockpiles

## Milestones to come

- Next deadline for 2<sup>nd</sup> report submission: **31 Oct 2010** in order to inform the effectiveness evaluation process
- Both documents: report prepared by Secretariat based on the reports received and effectiveness evaluation to be considered by COP-5 in 2011
